Matt served in four police forces and was the first Chief Constable to be appointed unanimously by all political parties - including Sinn Fein. During his career, he was privileged to be involved in policing and advocacy at the highest levels in Downing Street, the White House and the Vatican.

His story is one of challenge but also God's goodness, direction, and authority over his life.

Where did Alpha come from?

Alpha was started by a London church called Holy Trinity Brompton in 1990 to create space for people to process their personal beliefs and faith. It was developed to allow people with various perspectives to come together to talk about life's big questions, as well as unpack the basics of Christian faith. Since then, it has become an international organisation. Millions of people from across the world have tried Alpha and it has been translated into 112 different languages.


Alpha is run in churches, prisons, coffee shops and different, but generally they have three things in common: food, a talk or film and
